The following day they rose to the challenge that lay ahead and hit the moors at 06:00 and stomped through the next check points in quick succession.

Ethan and his team finished the challenge on Sunday afternoon crossing the line with proud beaming smiles and applauding spectators gathered at the finish line cheering them in. A great achievement!
