3pm - 4pm

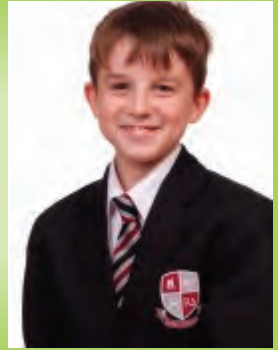


Homework Club is available to all students. If your computer/printer is not working or internet access is poor, then come to homework club.
