#### **Breton Musician**

On Friday, 7S had a special visitor to their French lesson. Dom Duff is a French songwriter and musician from Brittany who sings all his music in the Breton language. As Celtic regions, both Brittany and Cornwall have a lot in common, not least their flags, both black

and white, and their traditional fishing industries. However, although Kernewek and Brezhoneg langauges have many similarities, the Cornish language has all but disappeared from use. In comparison, approximately 240,000 in the region of Brittany speak Brezhoneg fluently. It is the first language of most Bretons, followed by French. Dom came in to play a few songs for us and tell us a little about his heritage.

### England U15 Pole Vault Champion soars to the top of UK rankings!

Molly Caudery produced a stunning finish to the season, not only smashing her personal best in the pole vault but also soaring to the top of the UK rankings.

Molly won the England
